## Big harvest for valley retailers

Campaigns targeting women shoppers, Canadian tourists give November a boost

CONWAY — The leaves have fallen but the snow still hasn't. But what used to be one of the slowest times of year for retail in Mount Washington Valley has become one of the busiest in Mount Washington Valley.

The introduction of retail holidays like Harvest to Holiday and the "Bring a Friend" event last weekend at Settlers' Green have provided a jolt to the local economy and transformed a former slow period into a "multi-million-dollar weekend"

in the valley.

"When Harvest to Holiday started it was totally geared toward building a shoulder season in the valley," said Marti Mayne, publicist for the Mt. Washington Valley Chamber of Commerce. "But it has gained momentum ... and it does tend to be a great shopping time for

the valley."

Harvest to Holiday began as a chamber event in 2000 and focused almost exclusively on bolstering retail through marketing from late October through Thanksgiving. Since its inception, the event has grown and spread through other sectors of the tourism economy.

"It has a ripple effect," Mayne said. "It brings people in to shop, but they come and stay overnight so they are here for two days, eat in local restaurants, shop local stores and stay in local lodging."

Final duty for Wade is to welcome Steve Solomon

CONWAY — Just before he retired Friday afternoon, one of Larry Wade's final duties as chief of the Conway Village Fire Department was to pass on his hat to new chief Steve Solomon, who has served as Tamworth's first full-time chief for the past two years. Solomon accepted the job earlier in the week, and starts full-time in Conway on Dec. 3.

## New Conway fire chief is from Tamworth

"I'm excited about the opportunity," said Solomon, who took a tour of the station with Jamie, his wife, and their three daughters Allison, 9; Danielle, 6; and Christina, 4, Friday afternoon.

The Solomon family will look for a home in Conway, but it may take a while. "The commissioners realize what the real estate market is like and are being very supportive," he said.

Solomon, who was hired as Tamworth's first full-time fire chief in September, 2005, moved there with his family from Hillsboro. He began his career in fire fighting and emergency medicine as a volunteer in Hillsboro, and trained as an EMT and paramedic and took all the courses required to become a paid fire fighter. He brings 17 years experience to Conway.

"Conway was very attractive to me," Solomon said. "I knew the people in the department and had seen the equipment. I think it was a combination of things that attracted me. I have a strong EMS (Emergency Medical Services) background, which is something we don't do in Tamworth, and I wanted to get back in where I can make some positive progress on the EMS and fire side."

Solomon said no replacement has been announced for the Tamworth job. It was posted Friday morning. He will continue to work for the department until Nov. 28.

Wade thinks Solomon is a good candidate to fill his shoes.

"He's a good guy and a great fit for this department," Larry Wade, outgoing chief said on his final day at the station Friday. "He's highly quali-

fied and way smarter than I am. He's excited. His family is excited and the guys in this department are excited. In the words (of former Conway Town Manager) Jim Somerville it's a win, win situation."

Solomon had equal praise for Wade, whom he met during his first week as chief in Tamworth and struck up not only a positive working relationship but a good friendship as well. "Larry is a great guy," he said. "We'd all love to see him stay but we'll congratulate him in his retirement, too. I think we're all a little bit envious of what he's going to do."

Friday marked Wade's last day on the force. Wade, who has served on the Conway Fire Department for 28 years, including the last 21 full-time and the past 17 as the fire chief, will pursue another passion — fishing — in Florida next week.

At 48, and in good health, Wade said the time is right to enter another facet of his life. He plans to move to a campground in Marathon, Fla., (located 40 miles from Key West), but will keep his house in Conway, where he wants to return every June and enjoy all this area has to offer.

At the campground, Wade will work as a bartender in a Tikki lounge. "It's right on the beach, five nights a week so I have all my days to fish or do whatever I'd like to do. I'm actually trying to get another job now working on a fishing boat two days a week to try to gain a little bit more experience. You can never have enough experience fishing. I'm finishing up my Coast Guard captain's license."

What will Wade miss the most? "The people, definitely the people," he said. "It's been a pretty good ride."


